



## Bruce Allen Crider

May 3, 1954 - January 29, 2018

Dr. Bruce Allen Crider died on Monday, January 29, 2018 following a 3-year battle with cancer. He was 63 years old. He is survived by his wife of 24 years, Debbie, and by his father, Ernest Ford Crider. Bruce was preceded in death by his mother Gladys and his brother Larry. Bruce was born on May 3, 1954 in Toledo, Ohio to his parents Gladys and Ford Crider. He attended Old Orchard School for elementary and junior high education. He attended DeVilbiss High School from 1968-1972, Ohio Northern University from 1972-1973, University of Toledo from 1973-1977, and Medical College of Ohio from 1978-1982. Bruce completed an Anesthesiology residency at University of Michigan Hospital in 1986 and remained there, as faculty, until the time of his death. Bruce enjoyed many types of music. He was an avid pianist. His favorite artist was Diana Krall. Bruce was a voracious reader who was fascinated by history, politics, and constitutional law. Other hobbies/interests over the years included sailing, fishing, golf, and billiards. Visitation will take place at the Robison-Bahnmler Funeral Home in Saline on Saturday, February 10, 2018 from 11:00 A.M. until the time of funeral service at 12:00 Noon. Pastor Tom Schroeder officiating. A luncheon will follow the service and will take place at Mac's in Saline. Private burial will take place in the Glen Eden Memorial Park in Livonia, MI at a later date.
