August 18, 1958 - September 21, 2013

Age 55, passed away on Saturday, September 21, 2013 at the Annapolis Hospital in Wayne, MI. He was born on August 18, 1958 in Detroit, MI, the son of Ralph Wesley and Irene Barbara (Papp) Mehler. On December 4, 1987 at the First Congregational Church in Wayne, MI, he married Marie Halberstadt and she survives. Howard graduated from Saline High School class of 1976. He went on to receive his B.M.E from Eastern Michigan University in 1982, his M.A. from Eastern in 1987, and his D.M.A. from the University of Michigan in 1997. Also during that time Howard was a music and math teacher in the Wayne-Westland Community Schools and had been since 1985. Other survivors in addition to his wife include his mother Irene Mehler, mother and father-in-law Ray and Irene Halberstadt, brother David (Lori) Mehler, sister Barbara (William) Hammons, brother-in-laws Mark (Tracey) Halberstadt, and Frank Halberstadt, and sister-in-law Ruth Halberstadt. He was preceded in death by his father Ralph Wesley Mehler. A Memorial Service will be held on Wednesday, September 25, 2013 at 4:00 P.M. at the First Congregational Church in Wayne, MI, with Rev. John Lohmann and Rev. Lance Ness officiating. A public graveside service will take place on Wednesday, September 25, 2013 at 11:00 A.M. at the Macon Township Cemetery on Mills-Macon Road, with Rev.
