Bernard was born on January 20, 1939 to the late Joseph and Lena Ciulla of Houston, and passed away Sunday, July 24, 2022 in Canton, Michigan, with his wife Marie by his side. Bernard graduated from St. Thomas High School in 1956 and from the University of Houston in 1961 with a degree in Applied Science.
