Carman Courtney Dickinson, 96, of Saline, Michigan, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, December 12, 2018. He leaves his wife of 65 years, Margaret (Knack) Dickinson; his two sons, Chris Dickinson and his wife Sharon of Saline; Tim Dickinson and his wife Angela of Rochester, MN; three grandchildren; and four great grandchildren. Born and raised in Ontario, Canada, the son of William and Beatrice (Cousins) Dickinson, he immigrated to the United States in 1961. In his early years, he was a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) and was part of the Allied invasion forces on Juneau Beach (D-Day) in June 1944.
