The referee had to be replaced. It seems that he had been calling a lot of false infractions against the Trojans, so they took him out of the game! At a BSA camporee in Atlanta Mich., George competed in a canoe race. They had three false starts, as George kept on snapping the handle of the paddle with his aggressive first stroke. Finally, he started more gently, got going, and won the race. The last time I saw George was at his family hunting camp in Kalkaska. Joe Thibideau and I had troop 36 fishing for trout on the river opening day. It was good to see him again and remember his long association with the troop. I am saddened to learn of his passing. 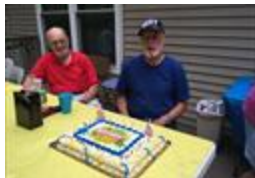
