John Frederick Newman passed away peacefully on Friday April 12, 2024 with family by his side. John was born April 2, 1937 to the late John Newman and Catherine Marguerite (Beard) Newman. On January 23, 1959 he married Diane Frances Splitt. He was happiest outdoors, enjoying fishing, camping, and hiking the mountains in North Carolina. John and Diane regularly traveled the U.S. and especially enjoyed the National Parks, Alaska and numerous trips to Hawaii. Outside the U.S. they also visited Canada, Germany and Italy. John was an avid University of Michigan sports fan and a season ticket holder for many years. He also enjoyed reading,

gardening, and working jigsaw puzzles. John was a God fearing man and a lifelong member of St. John's Lutheran Church of Bridgewater. “ It was a privilege for me to work for John Newman for much of my 23 years at the City of Ann Arbor. John modeled the traits of an outstanding department head and public servant. To every citizen, city council member, administrator, staff member and peer director, John was always respectful, listened fully before responding and looked for ways to accommodate requests and suggestions without playing favorites or bending protocols. He had the experience and patience to build partnerships and support for necessary change. The Philippines 4;8 selection from John’s funeral card seems especially appropriate to sum up his approach to others.

I recall many Ann Arbor projects that became standard procedures for the city and beyond during John’s tenure. One example is John’s authorization for a community-wide process to develop an Integrated Solid Waste Policy in 1988 to build a zero-waste economy (in today’s parlance) that set the stage for Ann Arbor’s overwhelmingly voter-supported Environmental Bond in 1990 to expand the city’s recycling, composting, waste reduction, environmental protection and worker safety goals. Among the many awards received for the department’s work, Ann Arbor was recognized in the 1990s by the U.S. EPA as one of the top 20 U.S. communities for waste reduction practices. Another example is John’s support—after strict grilling of staff to provide the research, budget, partners, public support and backup plans-- for banning computers and televisions at Ann Arbor’s municipal landfill based on the environmental hazards of lead and other toxics to groundwater. This local policy had unanimous Council support and soon became a state-wide standard, which led to nationwide (free) computer take-back programs by many electronics manufacturers.

John never let us forget that we were doing serious work with public money. And although he was strict, he had a light touch with his dry humor. I learned much from John Newman’s character and strive to carry forward at least some of his memorable qualities. He will be missed.
