May 22, 1928 - March 20, 2020

Lois Urban Stegeman, at age 91, died of natural causes on March 20, 2020 in Ann Arbor, MI. The second of four children, Lois was born in Bay City, MI, on May 22, 1928, and earned a Bachelor's and a Master's degree from the University of Michigan. She taught high school history and Spanish before marrying her beloved husband, John "Jack" Crawford Stegeman, in 1957, with whom she had three children. She thrived in her passion for music and for education, serving on the board of the University Musical Society (UMS) and establishing the Greenhills School parent auxiliary. A friend to many and a treasure to her family, Lois is greatly missed. The family has held a private burial service.
