Age 21, unexpectedly passed away on Tuesday, November 25, 2014. He was the son of Keith and Amy Lang of Saline. He was born on October 7, 1993. Today is going to be a bit tough. First, I have to proof read the death certificate and okay it. At some point, Officer Roth is bringing over Luke's phone and car keys that the police took originally. We haven't decided what to do about/with Luke's car. We know we can't give it to Tim. It is a very personalized vehicle. Luke fell asleep driving and crashed into a semi-truck on I-94 last spring. He was driving in the left lane and the semi was in the right lane. Luke was unhurt, but the right side of his car was a mess. The engine was fine. With help from his Uncle Steve and friend Shane (plus Shane's wonderful grandmother), Luke pieced the car back together with junk yard parts – not all in the same color. Then, I got one of those special markers and wrote “Tis but a flesh wound” on the rear right passenger window. Then Luke wrote “I've 'ad worse” on the left rear passenger window.

“ Luke was good beyond belief. Maybe he was just too good for this world. Luke was extremely emotionally sensitive, not only for himself, but for others. He felt everything deeply, whether it was his own hurt or others’. He was so compassionate of others, from the time he was very small. Toward the end of his kindergarten year, we were at the school for an Easter story and the class and parent helpers were all outside. One of his classmates fell and skinned her knee badly and was sitting on a chair near the school door crying. Luke went up to her and said “Oh, Gloria, I wish it was me instead of you!” Many teachers would tell me that he had such a heart for people. One teacher told me that Luke was a swan among ducklings.

He was also a giver – he gave away his money and possessions without thought – to anyone. We used to get frustrated because we would buy this or that for him, and then find that he didn’t have whatever it was...he had given it away. When little brother Tim was born, I had him in a play pen. I caught Luke trying to heft a Tonka Dump Trunk into the play pen for Tim to play with! I had to keep a net over the play pen after that, to protect Tim from Luke’s generosity!

Luke insisted on asking Jesus to be his savior at age two. I was doing the story telling for a Backyard Bible Club. Luke was supposed to just be in childcare. When several of the kids wanted to pray with me to ask Jesus to be their savior, suddenly, there was Luke, too! I said, “Luke, what are you doing here?” He said, “I want to ask Jesus to be my savior, too.” What could I do? Say, “No, you’re too young?”

Luke loved to sing, and he had perfect pitch, according to his piano teacher, but he didn’t like to sing in front of people. He used to always sing in the shower, so beautifully. The kindergarten teacher told me that he used to sing in the bathroom that was between the kindergarten and first grade classrooms, and that they could hear him singing. At home, we used to sing “Up from the grave he arose” together quite a bit, especially around Easter time. His preschool teachers at Joyland preschool discovered that Luke could sing the whole thing through perfectly and were so astonished that they had

him do it on stage for their annual show.

Luke walked and talked very early. When he was 18 mos. old, a speech pathologist told me that he had the grammar and vocabulary of a five year old. He loved to be read to. I could hardly get a thing done because as soon as we would finish one book, he would be back with another. No matter what I was doing, I would sit down on the floor with him right there – in the laundry room, in the kitchen, wherever, and read the book to him.

Luke was an early reader, not surprisingly, and completed the Chronicles of Narnia by C.S. Lewis in the 4th grade. He also came to adore the Lord of the Rings by J.R.R. Tolkien. He even learned some of the “Elvish” language Tolkien created for the books. In 5th grade, Luke played J.R.R. Tolkien as part of a historical talking wax museum show.

Luke loved animals. We had lots of them over the years. Of course, very special to him, is his own dog, Merry (named after a hobbit).

Two stories I want to tell, though: We had goats for about 5 years.

We also tended to have very bad mosquitos in our yard in the summers. One time, when the mosquitos were very bad, he took it upon himself to go out and use up an entire can of mosquito spray on the poor goats. I believe he also got the ducks and chickens.

During winter, we had to carry out buckets of hot water twice a day for the animals because the water would freeze. Luke thought dunking the ducks in the hot water would help warm them up. Poor ducks. They did survive, however.
