Margaret Caroline Paffel (known as Peggy) age 88, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, August 12, 2020 at Linden Square Assisted Living in Saline, MI from Alzheimer's disease. Peggy finished elementary school at St. Mary in Wayne and graduated in 1949 from Wayne High School.
