Nancy E. Starr, age 80, passed away on Wednesday, March 10, 2021 due to complications from Parkinsons. Nancy was born on November 3, 1940 in Manchester, NH. Nancy was the daughter of Walter and Charlotte (Clang) Blidberg. She had been a resident of Saline, MI from 1968 until 1982 and continued to live in the area. Nancy worked lastly with Instrumental Labs as a Lab Technician until her Parkinson diagnosis 25 years ago.
