William "Bill" Joseph Dunlap, age 81, of Saline, MI passed away peacefully at Independence Village of Plymouth on Sunday, July 20, 2025. The son of Alexander Dwight and Helen Doris Dunlap, Bill was born June 15th, 1944, in Lake Forest, IL and lived nearly his entire life in the Ann Arbor and Saline communities. He graduated from Ann Arbor Pioneer High School in 1962 and went on to attend and graduate from Eastern Michigan University in 1968. Bill married the love of his life, Diane, on January 28th, 1967. They were married for 55 years, until Diane's passing in 2022. On Saturdays in the fall, Bill could be found watching his beloved Michigan Wolverines, where he was a season ticket holder for over four decades. He loved playing golf, especially with his sons, and bowled on several leagues in Saline. Bill and Diane enjoyed traveling, and the two visited such destinations as Bermuda, Mexico, Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. He also enjoyed being a regular patron at his favorite local restaurants, Metzger's and Knight's Steakhouse.

Bill's life was marked by a fierce dedication to his family. His greatest joy came in watching his children and grandchildren in their games, recitals, and concerts. His home was always open to friends and family, where countless memories were made hosting holidays and joyful celebrations. What will be particularly missed was Bill's example of self-sacrifice. His life was never about him, but in service to those he loved.
